TRASH BINS

Trash Bins should only to be placed out 24 hours before and after collection day. Or other days they are to be out of public view, beh

after collection day. On the other days they are to be stored out of public view, behind your side gate, or in the enclosed garage. They are not to be stored in any location where they can be viewed from the sidewalk and/or street. Anyone to be found in violation of this rule will be subject to hearings and fines, per the Association's Enforcement & Fine Policy.

IS IT A HIVE OR JUST A SWARM OF BEES?

A migrating swarm of bees that stops to rest, while searching for a new nesting site, can often look like a bee hive at a quick glance. It is important to know and understand the difference. Normally the migrating swarm of bees will form a cluster about the size of a football. The cluster will begin the formation by clinging to a tree branch or other exposed location. The swarm will typically leave within 24-72 hours.

An established colony almost never leaves on its own. If the bees have established honeycombs, they will not leave. Typically, colonies are found in hollow spaces, such as, walls, roofs, chimneys, water meter boxes, etc. Never try to "convince" the bees to leave by using a water hose, lighting a fire or using hardware store sprays. Leave the bee hive removal to the licensed, insured professionals.

ARE ALL THE BEES DYING?

It is much harder to keep bees than it used to be. Beekeepers face a host of problems ranging from mites to disease and starvation. However, beekeepers are not going to run out of bees anytime soon and they are not endangered. If you saw a documentary or read a news article, remember that those are designed to create concern and are not always factual. The best way to support the beekeeping community is to buy local bee products, donate to bee research or host an educational event.

FUN BEE FACTS

- Queens lay up to 2,000 eggs per day.
- The worker bees are all female and they do all the work for the hive.
- Honey bees have five eyes.
- Honey stored in air tight containers never spoils.
- Honey speeds the healing of open wounds and also combats infection.
- Honey bees never sleep.
- The honeybee's wings stroke 11,400 times per minute. This action creates their distinctive "buzz".
- Bees fly an average of 15 miles per hour.
